

Stadium Regulations for the BOSSARD Arena and Academy Arena, Zug

1) Basic rules

- a) The EVZ, and respectively its companies EVZ Sport AG and The Hockey Academy AG, have domiciliary rights to all hockey games and events in the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena in Zug. By purchasing or receiving an admission ticket, the purchaser and owner accepts the general terms and conditions (GTC) laid down by contract, the behaviour standards and, in particular, the stadium regulations. These are displayed at all stadium entrances, at the stadium ticket points of sale (on panels) and are also published on www.evz.ch (as a pdf file). The following stadium regulations apply in each case to EVZ games in the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena on the respective match days.

The BOSSARD Arena and Academy Arena stadium regulations are based on and asserted through domiciliary rights, and in private as well as public law. Furthermore, they are based on the guidelines and provisions of the National League, the SIHF and the IIHF respectively.

- b) Visitors must follow the instructions of EVZ stadium stewards, EVZ security staff and law enforcement officers throughout the entire perimeter area and state their name and provide ID at the request of those groups of people listed here.
- c) Visitors need a valid entrance ticket to the stadium for the appropriate category within a given sector.
- d) Persons under a stadium ban (local, national and international) are not permitted to enter the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena, as well as the enclosed perimeter area. The perimeter area is described on www.evz.ch.
- e) Persons who appear to be under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs may be barred from entry.
- f) Visitors to the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena accept to undergo entry, ticket and security controls as well as body searches for suspicious and/or prohibited items.
- g) The sale or promotion of products/tickets to EVZ games not authorised by EVZ is prohibited within the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena, as well as in the perimeter area. Exceptions will only be granted in writing by the EVZ.
- h) Visitors must behave and dress in accordance with the generally accepted rules of conduct.
- i) The bringing of double holders, megaphones, flags etc. to EVZ games in the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena is subject to authorisation. Authorisation is given in writing by EVZ security staff. This permit must be presented at all times on request.
- j) Film and photo shoots in the BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena and in the whole perimeter area are only permitted with written permission from the EVZ and only for private use.

2. CCTV

The BOSSARD Arena, the Academy Arena and the perimeter area are all covered by CCTV. Visitors are aware and agree that, for reasons of public safety, and in order to prevent violations of stadium rules and the law, video recordings are made of the spectator areas.

3. Behaviour within the stadium

All persons entering the BOSSARD Arena or the Academy Arena must behave in such a way that no other person in the stadium is harmed, endangered or - more than is inevitable under the circumstances - hindered or harassed. During their presence in the stadium, they must obey instructions from the security staff, the stadium announcer and the police. The usual rules of behaviour are to be observed.

Actions, banners, provocations, gestures and words against third parties and against club interests are prohibited.

4. Forbidden objects

- All weapons and weapon-like items
- Pyrotechnic articles, ammunition and ammunition components
- Material that security staff consider could be used for disguises
- Gas spray bottles, pepper sprays, corrosive or colouring substances, pressure vessels containing harmful gases (except commercially available lighters)
- Objects that can be used as projectiles
- Cans, glass and plastic bottles, Tetra Paks, containers that are fragile or could splinter
- Laser pointers, vuvuzelas, gas horns and other items that could disturb the game
- Megaphones (except when in possession of authorisation from the organiser)
- Video cameras and professional photo equipment
- Racist, xenophobic and other extremist propaganda material
- Transparencies, banners, etc. with personality or honour insulting messages.
- Umbrellas, suitcases, sports bags, large bags, large backpacks and other bulky items (bags up to a size of 25x25x25cm are allowed)

The security staff are not obliged to ensure safekeeping of items confiscated (namely according to section 4 of these stadium regulations). The security staff refuses any liability for loss, damage or theft.

In addition, the National League rules governing access to the stadiums of National League clubs with unauthorised objects shall apply.

5. Criminal offences

- a) Behaviour that constitutes a criminal offence will be reported and prosecuted in accordance with the law.
- b) Spraying and the application of stickers/posters and advertising and the like are prohibited and will result in a claim for property damage.

6. Smoking ban

In application of § 48 et seq of the Canton of Zug Health Law, the entire BOSSARD Arena and the Academy Arena are non-smoking zones. Smoking is permitted only in designated outdoor areas.

7. Littering

Throwing away litter (paper, food, chewing gum, drinks, cigarettes, etc.) is prohibited in the BOSSARD Arena, the Academy Arena and the corresponding perimeter.

Enough litter bins are provided.

Littering is punishable.

8. Protection of the ice rink

- a) Throwing objects (coins, programmes, drinks, etc.) onto the ice rink and the area around the playing area is prohibited.
- b) Entering the ice rink and the area around the playing area is prohibited. Any infringement of this rule will result in a sanction.

9. ID checks. Personal data

- a) When entering the BOSSARD Arena or the Academy Arena, spectators can be searched for forbidden objects, without any grounds for suspicion, all over the body by persons of the same gender. Likewise, when entering the BOSSARD Arena or the Academy Arena, visitors' identity may be controlled and recorded, without grounds for suspicion. To this end, a visitor's face and also identity card (official identity document such as ID, driver's license, resident's permit, etc.) may be photographed. The data collected is used to match the identity with any entries in the HOOGAN information system and to check for any criminal record. In the event of a refusal to undergo a body search and/or identity check, access to the BOSSARD Arena or the Academy Arena will be denied without compensation.
- b) Video footage and photos may be passed to the judiciary for investigative purposes. They may also be published including on the Internet.
- c) These procedures are allowed by Federal and Cantonal legislation. You can obtain further information by following this [Link](#) to the Fedpol.

10. Sanctions

- a) The EVZ expressly reserves the right to impose its own sanctions and/or take legal action against persons who violate the stadium regulations.
- b) Violations of these Stadium Regulations may be sanctioned by the EVZ without any possibility of complaint. Sanctions are pronounced verbally or in writing and usually confirmed in writing within 14 days. Sanctions come with a charge to be paid by those affected. In addition, no correspondence will be entered into regarding the case.
- c) Sanctions may include:
 - A local, national or international stadium ban, even lifelong (in general, stadium bans are issued in accordance with the rules and regulations of the National League)
 - Carrying out work for the EVZ without payment
 - Fines payable to the EVZ
 - Civil law claims
 - Criminal prosecution
 - An exclusion order
 - further measures
- d) Personal data of offending visitors can be passed on for investigative purposes. Stadium bans are reported to the Swiss Ice Hockey Federation (SIHF), the police and other authorised bodies. Single ticket and season ticket payments will not be refunded in the event of exclusion from the stadium or a stadium ban.
- e) Offending visitors will be held liable for the damage and expenses resulting from their behaviour. Fines and sanctions imposed by the EVZ resulting from visitors' behaviour must be paid by the offending visitors. In all events, a processing fee of CHF 250 will be charged.

11. Disclaimer of liability

The EVZ and its staff disclaim any liability for claims resulting from accident, injury, illness or medicinal incompatibility. The visitor uses the facilities available at his/her own risk and responsibility. The EVZ and its staff also disclaim any liability in cases of loss, theft or damage to personal effects. Lost property is handed over to the security staff and can be picked up at the Zug Ice Rink (Kunsteisbahn) during office hours.

The EVZ cannot be held responsible or liable to pay damages for games or training sessions that cannot take place due to, in part or in whole, external circumstances (climatic conditions, power failures, machine defects, etc.).

These stadium regulations are not exhaustive and can be adapted to circumstances or special occasions at any time.

Any person entering the BOSSARD Arena or the Academy Arena recognises that they remain in the BOSSARD Arena or the Academy Arena or its perimeter at their own risk. They further acknowledge that the organiser and/or the owner of the BOSSARD Arena (including their internal bodies and responsible persons) shall not be liable for any risks, dangers and losses (including damage to physical or mental integrity or to property and the loss of property).

This waiver of the assertion of any claims applies regardless of whether the incident occurred before, during or after the event. Only cases of gross negligence or intent fall outside this disclaimer.

12. Jurisdiction clause

For all disputes in connection with this contract, the place of jurisdiction shall that of EVZ's registered office. The parties agree Swiss law shall be applicable.
